Living only in COLD, WET FORESTS, they build large nests made of shredded bark, woven together into a ball. Family members will sleep during the day HUDDLED TOGETHER within the warm nest

comprising a breeding pair and several generations of their young

MAJOR THREATS

Their habitat is often threatened by major bushfires. On Black Friday in 1939, 80% of the possum's range burnt.

They rely on old eucalyptus tree hollows for safe shelter during the day. These trees are usually more than 190 years old. Due to fires and logging, these trees are now hard to find in the possum's habitat and this poses a major threat to the species.

The Lowland Leadbeater's Possum is critically endangered with less than 40 in the wild.

Healesville Sanctuary currently has the only Leadbeater's Possums in captivity anywhere in the world and are attempting to breed them.



Zoos Victoria is working with our partners to restore the habitat of the Leadbeater's Possum. More than one million trees and shrubs were planted in Yellingbo between 2014-2018.
