## MAJOR THREATS

The OBP is one of the world's rarest birds – there are less than 50 in the wild and is critically endangered.

One of the major threats is the **lack of females** in the wild.

A recent outbreak of beak and feather disease has also affected numbers.

Other threats include habitat loss and the increase of predators.
